Kim Quintrell spoke about an alarm call she had 1 year ago that 911 said it would be 2 hours before a deputy could respond. She also spoke about a pack of feral dogs running wild in the Sumerco area. She thought the Sheriff's Department desperately needed a humane officer. The Commission answered as many questions as they could. However, they directed the legal questions to Jim Gabehart, Prosecuting Attorney. Mary is going to call the animal shelter and get the costs of sending animals to the shelter again. Also, President Vance suggested the Commission write a letter to the DNR asking what we could do to help them with catching the feral dogs.

Budget Update – Guy Browning, Assessor gave an update of the expected deficit the County will be sustaining due to lower coal taxes. He anticipates the county will drop from a Class 5 to a Class 6 due to a 30 million dollar decrease in oil and gas. With the preliminary numbers, the Assessor's Office has, the county will feel at the least a \$240,000.00 decrease for taxes due this next fiscal year. President Vance had Mary to give an update. We are currently down \$264,091.80 in taxes from the previous year. We are \$544,545.75 behind to the jail. We have been paying a \$20,000.00 payment to the jail since November of 2015, however the last time we have made a payment was August 2016. We received Coal Severance tax for the first quarter in the amount of \$15,828.00 Last January we received \$66,665.00 The Commission is trying to operate the Government as financially stringent as they can. There will be cuts in the new fiscal year but we can't wait until the new fiscal year. The Commission is asking all Elected Officials to enact a hiring freeze. Direl Baker, County Clerk; Guy Browning, Assessor; and Charles Brumfield have already been asked and they are not filling any position from employees that resign or retire. The Commission also has asked each elected official to not use overtime if not completely necessary.
